The purpose of this correspondence is to provide formal proof of endorsement for fulfillment of the SAFER grant's requirements.

The goal of our application, which is the hiring of new firefighters, requires the City of Eagleville, Tennessee, the grantee, to maintain staffing levels with our local fire department and incur no layoffs during the two-year period of performance of the grant.

Upon awarding of the SAFER grant, the City of Eagleville will be able to fund two (2) new fulltime firefighters, including benefits, workman's comp, training, etc., so that our department could accommodate 24-hour coverage and ultimately improve its ISO rating.

The City Council ensures that it understands the long-term obligations of the grant and is fully committed to maintaining those requirements upon acceptance of the grant award. ORDINANCE # 2015-004

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF EAGLEVILLE, TENNESSEE,
AMENDING ORDINANCE 2014-03 THE ANNUAL BUDGET FOR THE FISCAL YEAR
BEGINNING JULY 1, 2014 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2015.**

Whereas, *Tennessee Code Annotated* Title 9 Chapter 1 Section 116 requires that all funds of the State of Tennessee and all its political subdivisions shall first be appropriated before being expended and that only funds that are available shall be appropriated; and

Whereas, *Tennessee Code Annotated* Title 6 Chapter 56 Section 208 allows the City to amend the budget ordinance in the same manner as any other ordinance may be amended.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EAGLEVILLE, TENNESSEE that Section 1 & 2 of Ordinance 2014-03 are hereby amended as follows:
