CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 7:02 p.m. by Mayor Sam Tune.

INVOCATION

Invocation was offered by John E. Turner

PLEDGE OF ALLIGIANCE

Police Chief Elijah Stuard led the Pledge of Allegiance.

ROLL CALL

Roll was called by City Recorder Amy Von Almen, with a quorum present. Vice Mayor Alan Ball and Councilman David Rigsby were absent.

MAYORS WELCOME

Mayor Tune welcomed everyone in attendance to the meeting.

CITIZENS INPUT

Mayor Tune invited anyone who wished to speak to please come forward. Mr. Neal Solomon came forward to speak about the condition of the roads and ditches at Eaglecrest Subdivision.

OLD BUSINESS

Update on Donation of Landscaping

Mayor Tune commented on the exceptional and generous landscaping donated by owners John & Casey Lewis of Stonegate Enterprises. The City paid for the removal of the black top and the installation of the curb and sidewalk. The topsoil for the landscaping was donated, and Fire Chief Terry Greene donated his time and the use of his backhoe to help in the preparation of the landscape beds and adding the new topsoil. Bob Weske, owner of A&B Paint Contractors, donated his time and labor to seal the front wall of City Hall in preparation for the lettering. Mayor Tune mentioned that the lettering for City Hall should be installed next week and that the Sons of Confederation Monument would be arriving soon and a dedication would be held for the monument in a couple of weeks. Mayor Tune also pointed out that the installation of the “Blink” electric car chargers has also been completed.

SEWER UPDATE

Mayor Tune gave a brief update of the sewer. He announced that as painful as it was, due to the State no longer allowing the City to have a permit for a MBR system, this would mean a change in the type of sewer system and also a change in the location of the sewer. Because of these changes, the grants the City had previously applied for were no longer available. Some of

the information can be reused and the City will be working hard to meet deadlines and to update grant applications with the new sewer information. He mentioned that the Council would probably need to meet soon to make some decisions regarding the sewer, so that the City could proceed in a timely manner to meet these deadlines.
